

Tie-Breaking Procedures for Provincial Playdowns 2011

Applicable only when the total number of goals in the series is tied after regulation time in Game #2.

***Coaches, please inform the Officials/Referees of this procedure prior to the start of the game (including the NOTES at the bottom of this page).*

The Senior Female Rules and Regulations (10.3.5) state:

"Series shall be played on a home and home total goal (two games) series with no overtime being played in the first game. If overtime is required in the second game, refer to Rule #83 "Tied Game", of the Hockey Canada Official Hockey Rules. Special permission is required from the Senior Female Representative for any alternate method wanting to be used in determining a League Representative team for Provincial play if different than above".

The Senior Female Reps are proposing an alternate Tie Breaker method due to the unavailability of extended ice time, which is covered in the rules and regulations (above).

"Teams will play a 5 minute overtime period followed by a 3 player shoot-out and if it is still tied then it is sudden death shoot-out."

This is the way that it will be endorsed by Hockey Alberta Female Council.

NOTES:

1. Coaches will have 1 minute after the end of regulation time to name their first three shooters.
2. Visiting Team shoots first.
3. First three shooters may not shoot again until all other players have shot. This also applies to the individual shooters in the sudden death shoot-out.
4. **Sudden death shoot-out** means the team shooting second in the rotation still has the opportunity to shoot should the team shooting first in the rotation score a goal.
5. If at the end of the Overtime Period – a player is serving a penalty, the **penalized player cannot be included in the first three (3) shooters**. The penalized player can be included in the one to one individual shooter group.
